

LEHIGH ACRES COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING

The meeting was **CALLED TO ORDER** by President Rick Anglickis at 6:00 p.m.

A **QUORUM** was established with 11 members present.

Tyler Woodby made a motion to approve the agenda, Mohamed Yasin 2nd the motion, approved by the membership unanimously as completed at 6:20 p.m which was after the arrival of Bob and Linda Saul.

Mohamed made a motion to approve the Minutes and Tyler 2nd the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

First Vice President Report: Charles Edwards had no report. A discussion took place regarding Mr. Edwards duties as First Vice President. According to the Council Minutes of May, 2018 it was agreed Mr. Edwards would take over all of the responsibilities of Joan Cunningham, who resigned as First Vice President on May 14, 2018. Diane Turrill confirmed Joan had verbally conveyed to her that Joan resigned from the Community Council and Incorporate Lehigh. Mr. Edwards will call a meeting of the Incorporate Lehigh, Inc. membership and Board Members.

Second Vice President Report:

Street Lighting: Mohamed is chairing the committee, Bob Saul and Tyler Woodby are also on the committee. All school bus stops will be the priority. If a school bus stop does not have a street light, report it to Lorie Borman at 239-533-2308.

ARB: On the corner of Lee Blvd and Sunshine a Waffle House will be built, on the corner of Alabama and Homestead a 7-11 with gas pumps will be built. The Race Trac gas station on Lee Blvd will be open August 1st. On the south side of Lee Blvd a medical center is under construction.

New Business: Tyler Woodby presented a plan to rebrand and modernize the Community Council. Tyler asked to form a committee to explore the options available. Mohamed will join Tyler in forming the committee. Anyone wishing to be on this committee should contact Tyler or Mohamed.

Tyler made a motion and Charles seconded the motion to accept Gwyn Gittens and Robert Antkiewicz as members of the Council. The motion passed unanimously.

LAMSID has requested from the State Legislature the ability to control signage in Lehigh Acres. LAMSID is also requesting an entrance sign into Lehigh that names the community Lehigh Acres Municipality. LAMSID would take over the counties responsibility for the signs, which includes permitting. Charles Edwards reported LAMSID's intention is to stop Fort Myers from encroaching into Lehigh. Will Bronson made a motion to invite a representative from LAMSID to the Council's next meeting to clarify the signage issue. Linda Saul 2nd the motion, motion carried with a "yes" vote.

Tyler made a motion for the Council to Adopt a Road. The motion was tabled until Tyler has the opportunity to explore which roads are available to be adopted.

Charles to bring names for the Recognize Lehigh Acres Clean up.

Old Business: Election Forum. Rick has not been able to secure a sight at one of the schools because it is to be held on a Saturday and the schools would be required to have school employees there to unlock the facility and clean up afterward. Tyler suggested using Veteran's Park. Annisa Karim will check to see if the date (August 11th) is available and will let Tyler know. Tyler will confirm the date and time to Melissa Bill for publishing in the Citizen.

Troyer Mine: DOT has not performed a study on the roads. Isaac Gray has a petition against the mine addressing the number of trucks that will utilize Sunshine and State Road 82. The petition is available on line at nomineon82.com.

Parks and Recreation: Annika Karim announced Club Rec will open at Veterans Park after school hours. The fee is \$100.00 per month per child.

Public Comments: Yep Dervahanian announced Westminster Golf Course is up for sale.

Jonathan Bower does not want to see the Troyer Mine project to be approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
